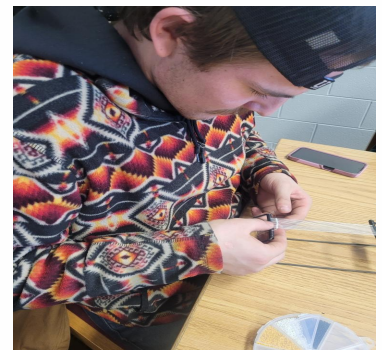
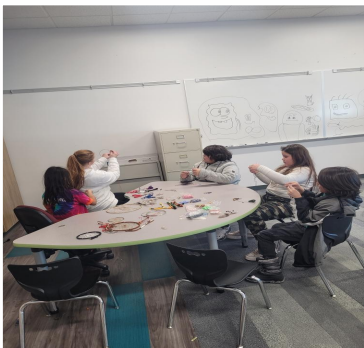

MCPS NASS staff shareouts



January was filled with a lot of learning and activities. Seeley Swan High School students started beading projects and I started working with the Jeanette Rankin students. I will meet with them twice per month, during their lunch times. The first meeting of the month is spent having lunch together, talking about Montana's tribal people, along with sharing stories and information. The second monthly meeting is an active hour of crafts, activity, games, or learning. For January, we made dream catchers. Please reach out if you would like to help me out by teaching any crafts, activities, or learning topics.

I continue to meet with teachers, at their convenience, to see how they can incorporate IEFA in their classrooms. An introduction to IEFA was offered as an after school professional development opportunity, and while it was a small group, the teachers who came are very dedicated to learning about Montana's tribal people and teaching what they learn to our students. Our department also collaborated with SPARK! Arts to bring in Aspen and Cameron Decker for a professional development on the topic of ledger art.

Willard: This month I only got to make it to the school twice, due to no school on a couple of Mondays. I'm working with counselors to make sure each of our graduates have caps and gowns ordered. We are finishing up our little beading project to move on to the next, which is beading graduation caps. We also have a parent who would like to come and volunteer to help with demonstrating how to bead your cap. I have been recruiting students to attend the RISE meeting on Tuesdays, and I was glad to see there were more in attendance at the last meeting. I will work with them on introducing themselves.



Sentinel: We have been meeting regularly for our RISE meetings every other Tuesday. I had a student enter the RISE youth conference logo contest, unfortunately he wasn't selected. The RISE committee is still however sending him an honorarium. I have been meeting with counselors more often, due to some bullying that has been going on. The admin and counselors have addressed it. I am also in contact with the senior counselor to check the status of graduation for our Native students. Sentinel AD would like to have the crosstown game with Hellgate to be similar to the one with Big Sky in which our Native Sentinel shirts were worn. We also well be selling our native Sentinel shirts soon. Waiting to meet with Sentinel AD to get things going.

Washington MS: The last couple meetings were small. I did talk about the N7 games that were held and showed the video of the late Malia Kipp. There were some students who got to participate in the event carrying out the Montana tribal flags. I am trying to work with the principal to get a set room for us to meet. We have been bouncing around and it's confusing my students when they can't find me.

Hellgate: I am meeting more of the staff. They are reaching out to me for more adult support for the students they work with. Also, I got to talk with Principal Miller and he is supporting me with getting a room so we can start beading during lunch and maybe get ready for beading graduation caps.

Lewis and Clark: In my monthly meeting with my All Nations students I brought over our department's buffalo box and got to share pictures and talk about MCPS first ever buffalo harvest. They enjoyed it! I also did get asked by staff to come and visit with a few students.

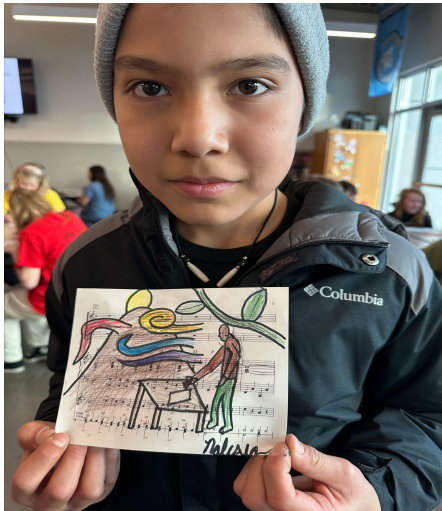
Hello - Hello!!!

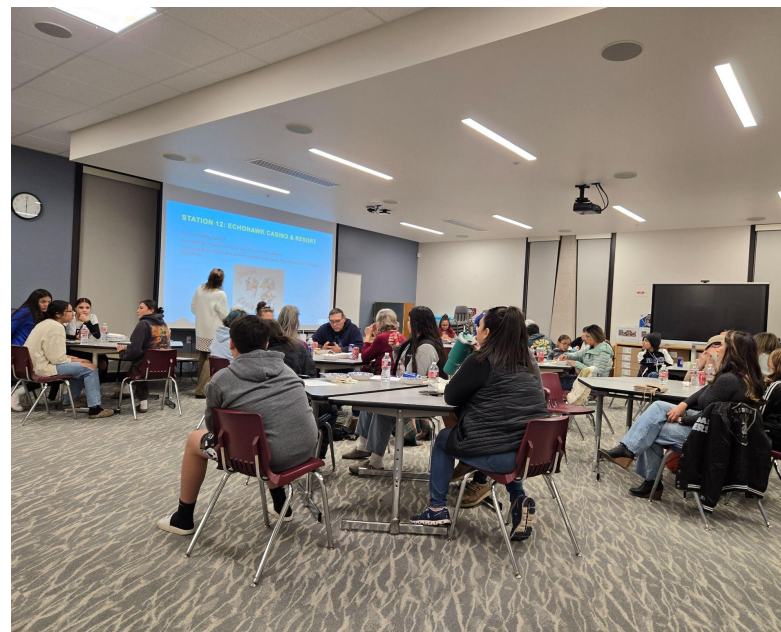
