ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

The teacher will:

- Implement EngageNY strong Tier 1 instructional protocols that increase reading skills for all learners.
- Implement Tier 2-3 targeted interventions for students scoring below proficiency such as small-group instruction and regular progress monitoring.
- Monitor progress through the EarlyBird assessment for grades EL-2 and the ExactPath assessment for grades 3-11.
- Analyze assessment data regularly to identify areas for improvement and adjust instructional strategies accordingly.
- Offer additional support for struggling learners and English language learners to address specific ELA skill gaps.

The parents will:

- Support literacy through regular opportunities to read together and independently at home.
- Ask students about their daily learning and engage in conversation to grow the connection between home and school.

The student will:

- As a confident learner, I will persevere and adapt to achieve self-identified goals related to my growing skills in English Language Arts.
- As an effective communicator, I can discuss texts content to grow vocabulary, communication skills, and comprehension skills.

curately responding to the three Teacher Clarity driving questions ("What am I learning?", "Why am I learning this?", "How will I know I am successful?").

Throughout the 2024-25 school year,

every student in grades 6-8 will engage in the ExactPath ELA assessment to in-

crease student proficiency in ELA as measured by a minimum 10% increase from fall 2024 to spring 2026 in the number

of students meeting proficiency at each grade level from the September 2024 to

the April/May 2026 benchmarks.

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- Implement targeted interventions such as small-group instruction.
- Monitor progress through the ReadyMath assessment for grades K-5 and the ExactPath assessment for grades 6-11.
- Analyze assessment data regularly to identify areas for improvement and adjust instructional strategies accordingly.

Offer additional support for struggling learnings and English Language learners to address specific math skill gaps.

The parents will:

- Help build connections between mathematical skills and applications in the world around them.
- Provide consistent opportunities for students to share their learning and engage in practice.

The student will:

- Analyze and interpret mathematical problems, using agile thinking to demonstrate critical and creative thinking.
- Act as a skilled collaborator, sharing my problem solving thought process with peers, families, and my teachers.

In the 2024-25 School Year

This progress will be evidenced by administrative walkthroughs conducted in each quarter, with administrators randomly surveying at least 25% of the student population. Throughout the 2024-25 school year,

every student in grades 6-8 will engage in the ExactPath Math assessment to increase student proficiency in math as measured by a minimum 10% increase from fall 2024 to spring 2026 in the number of students meeting proficiency at each grade level from the September to the April benchmarks.

School Culture

 We are a welcoming school community, growing and expanding for caregivers, community, students, and staff to engage and interact regularly. We achieve this by creating opportunities, building trust, and being consistent.

Our goal is to increase school and family

partnership scores to the 70s by the spring MRA survey.

We are learning to grow visible learners through a focus on Teacher Clarity subjects. We have a school-wide focus on student learning.

Our goal is to increase the number of students being able to answer the 3 Teacher Clarity Questions. At least 75% of students can answer 2 of the 3 questions by the end of the school year and 25% of students can answer all 3 questions by the end of the school year.

 We value a welcoming school culture that embraces diversity where individuals feel a strong sense of belonging. We achieve this by building trusting and positive relationships with our staff, students, caregivers, and community partners. We will be consistent, predictable and reliable.

Our goal is to increase student empowerment scores above 75 by the spring MRA survey.
